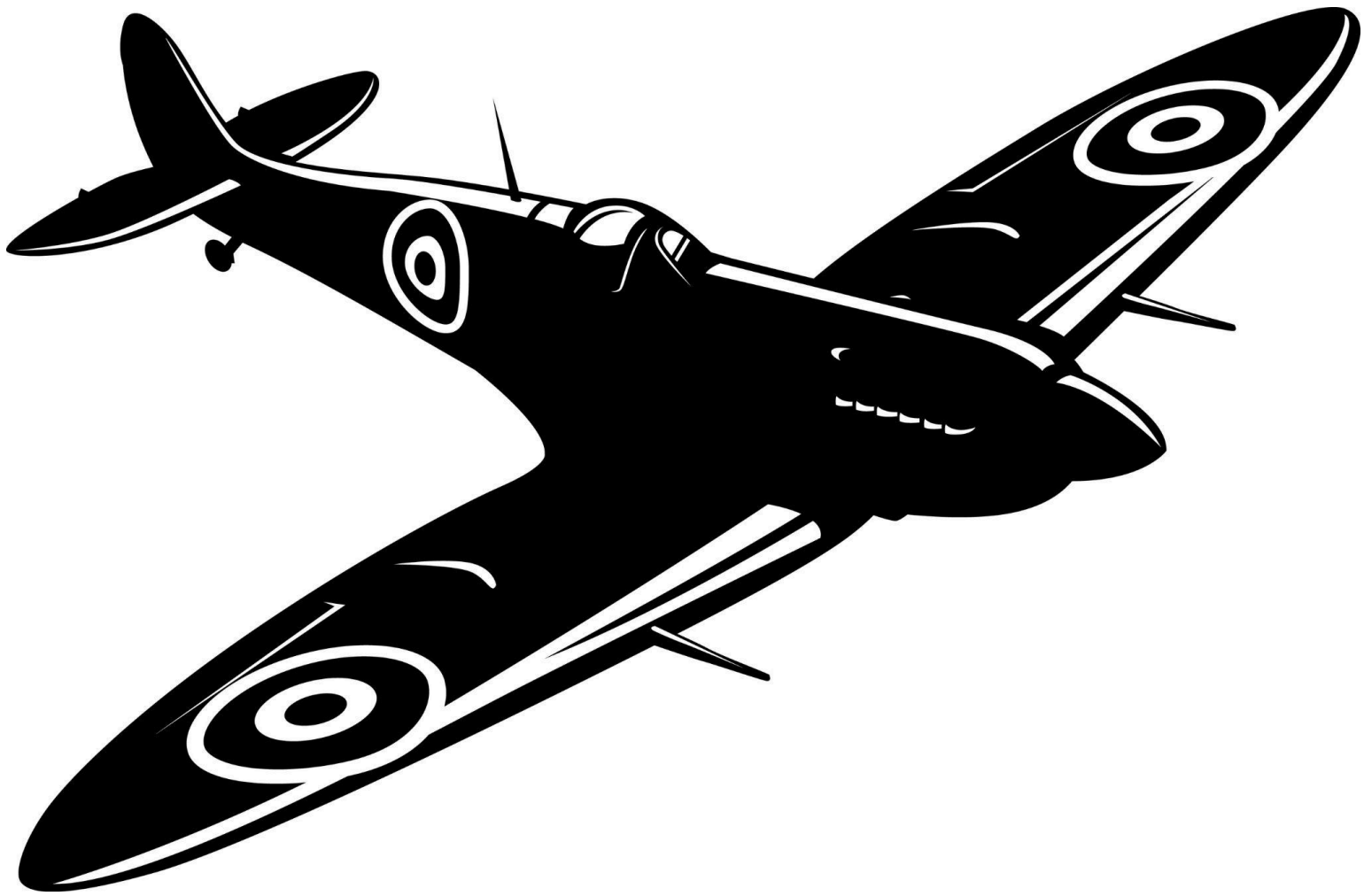

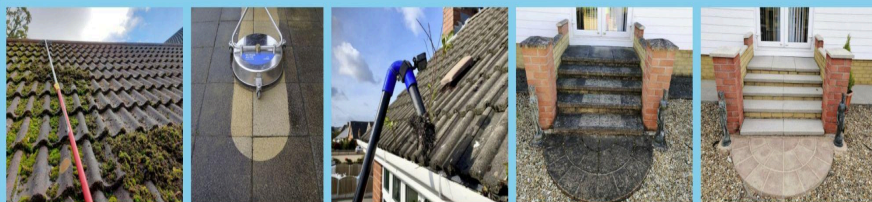

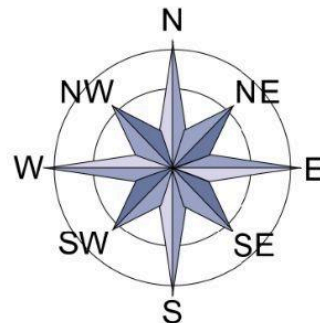

A Trip South

I arrived early January shortly after the longest day, but it wasn't until mid-January that the sun started to set, even if only briefly. The sun was out continuously for the first month and at times it felt quite mild. This was deceptive and due to the very dry atmosphere, with temperatures rarely rising above zero even though it was midsummer.

In the shade was thick ice with some of the buildings having snow over the roof.



The scenery was spectacular, with Rothera surrounded by towering peaks and ice cliffs. We could often hear huge explosions in the distance as ice cliffs collapsed into the sea. Every day the boat crew took scientists out and, if space was available, a call went out over the radio for volunteers. It wasn't until I

was in a boat speeding across Ryder Bay that I realised the scale of the place. The mountains in the distance were huge and just weren't getting any closer.

The scenery would often change. You'd leave the accommodation block and the view would be of the bay, calm like a mill pond. Hours later the wind would change and

the bay would be full of brash ice and enormous icebergs. When the wind changed again, hours later, the bay would be clear with not an iceberg in sight.

One day a call came over the radio that there were orca in the South Cove. I found a small group at the water's edge watching a mother killer whale teaching her calf to hunt seal whilst birds circled overhead. An amazing once in a lifetime sight. Penguins and seals were often seen near the base,

although not in the numbers seen in previous years, Orca pods and leopard seals would visit the bay periodically, checking ice flows for the seals and penguins, but would soon move on.

I saw a map on a wall one day dated 1996 of the surrounding peaks. I was amazed to find much on the map was just white and marked 'uncharted' I was even more amazed when I was informed that this was the latest map.

Rothera has the most southerly permanent runway, usable for only 4 months in summer. Further south runways are ice and the season very short. Late February saw many planes transiting north to south America, pulling teams out. Many seemed to be old DC-3 Dakotas, bringing through many nationalities. People returning from the pole seemed to be very tanned with huge beards. I shared a room with an American guy returning from the pole. He said he'd been travelling for 4 days and apologised for the smell!

Life at Rothera was very busy, with long hours, and a 6 day working week. In summer around 150 people live at Rothera, with about 30 people overwintering and staying for up to 18 months at

a time. Others would stay for only a few weeks. The internet was surprising good, and frequent calls home to the family were possible and kept me going.

Having seen many flights leave, it was finally my time to board a DeHavilland Dash 7 for a spectacular 4½ hour flight back along the peninsula to Tierra del Fuego eventually landing at Punta Arenas. It was great to feel some warmth and see trees, grass and colour again. It took 5 flights to get back to the UK, the last being 11½ hours.

On reflection, the thing that sticks with me about Antarctica is the incredible scale and beauty of the place, the abundant marine life, and the people with their nomadic lifestyle and incredible life stories. It was pointed out to me that regular meals, warm huts and internet were only a thin veneer of normality, and that astronauts on the international space station were closer to civilisation than we were. Human life has the most precarious grip in this inhospitable continent.

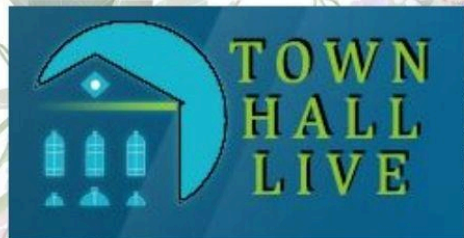

Torksey's Charity – can you help?

Torksey's Charity (registered charity 251454) has been operating in the town since 1855 and seeks to provide light financial assistance to residents of Kirton in Lindsey in need of some help.

It isn't part of the Town Council or North Lincolnshire Council, but exists in it's own right and the Charity budget is currently funded by renting land belonging to it.

Currently the Charity is looking for a couple more Trustees. The workload is very light; it requires at least one meeting per year to do administrative things, plus we meet if an application is made for assistance to discuss it and award financial help if deemed appropriate and helpful. It is a voluntary role and Trustees must be a current resident of, or have close links to, Kirton in Lindsey and be able to attend meetings in person.

The Charity was established to provide emergency financial assistance to local residents in need, applicants provide information to help us understand the situation they are in and how we can help. We then meet to discuss the information provided and try to determine the best way of assisting.

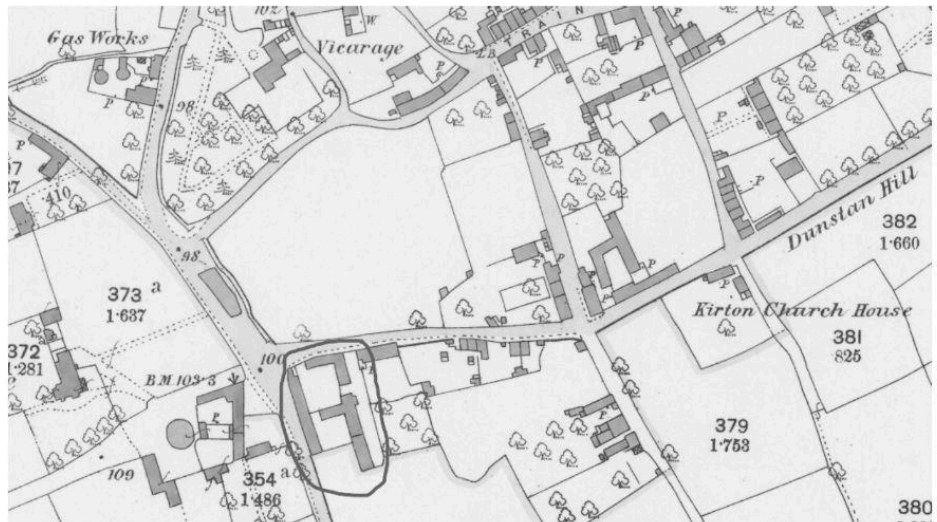

'Incendiarism in Kirton almost 190 years ago'

and Can you tell your 'Fathom from your Furlong'?

What is 'Incendiarism' you may ask? Historically it refers to the creation of civil strife or violence for political reasons, or inflammatory behavior/agitation. More commonly it means the act or practice of illegally setting fires (arson).

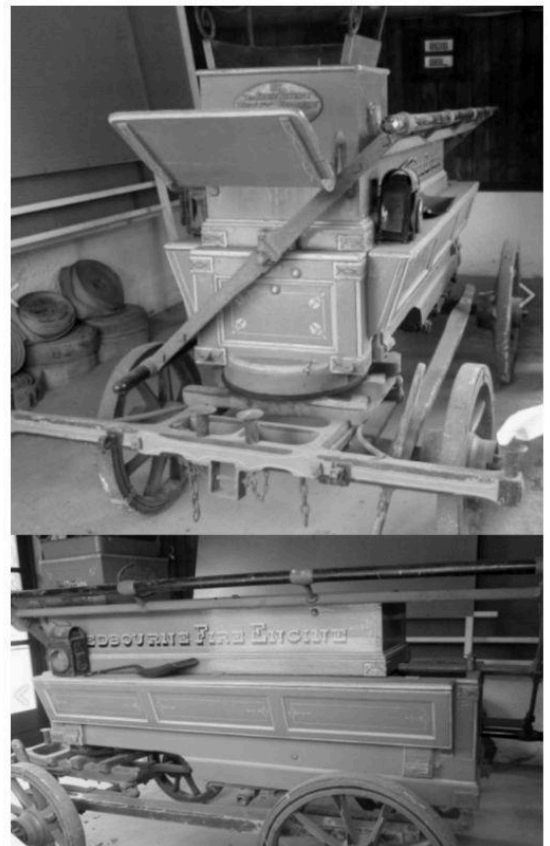
On the morning of Tuesday 2nd April 1839 the farmyard, stacks and buildings of Mr Joseph William Cook were CONSUMED BY FIRE. It is believed to have been this farm at the bottom of Dunstan Hill (circled). It was farmed by the Cook family (J W senior and his son J W junior, who is pictured) for several decades in the mid late 1800s before moving to take up residence at The Grange, situated on the North Cliff.



The waggon shed and stables were burned down but prompt action by farm hands and local residents saved the larger beasts and horses but sadly 3 ewes & 7 lambs in a pen were killed. Also consumed by fire were: 1 haystack, 1 clover stack, 1 pea stack, 1 wheat stack, part of an oat stack,

two waggons, harrows and other equipment.

The Kirton fire engine attended quickly; joined an hour later by the Redbourne fire engine (pictured). It was through the hard work by all in attendance, and a fortuitous change of wind direction, that more buildings



and the farmhouse did not fall victim to the flames. The Kirton fire engine had only been set up and purchased the year before.

It was thought to have been started deliberately so a committee of enquiry was set up and held the following day in the Manor Court House. It was led by C B Luard Esq., Rev. H J Pooley and two magistrates. Several prominent Kirton residents were included.

What happened then? - read more next time.

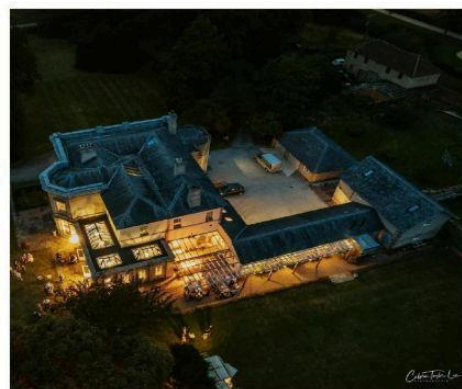

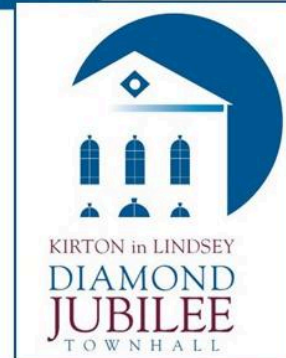

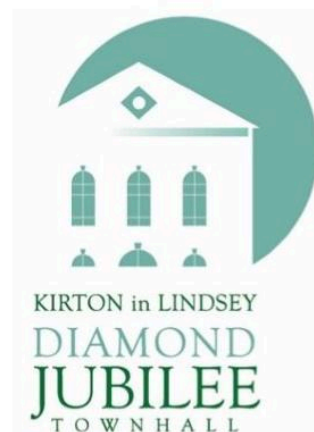

KLUSH – Kirton Lindsey Ukrainian Support Hub

Once again, the Ukraine war is sadly making headlines. The war has entered its fourth year with many terrible scenes hitting our news screens. In this time, KLUSH members have welcomed 15 Ukrainian guests to our town and have helped them settle here, far from the homes they knew. They have been supported to settle in with welcome packs, finding employment and suitable accommodation, travelling to and from places of work and appointments and generally making friends here.



This has not only been a lifeline to these individuals and families fleeing war, but has enabled Kirton folk to make new friends and understand more about Ukraine and its history and culture.

Although three families are still living close by and are in regular contact with their hosts, we feel it is now time to close KLUSH as an organisation. The future is still very uncertain for our guests with only an 18 month extension to their visas for now, but we feel that the friendships and mutual support that has grown from KLUSH is enough to continue supporting our friends on an informal basis from now on.

Much of the money raised by the initial fundraiser has been spent on welcome gifts, helping to finance essential journeys and supporting the guests to integrate into things like dance lessons and university. The small amount left will be donated to a local charity supporting Ukrainians as stated in our constitution.

The members of KLUSH would like to thank the community of Kirton Lindsey for their generosity in donating to the fundraising raffle and band night and to the local businesses who donated items of use to these families and to the individuals who gave up their time to provide much needed transport. We hope our lovely community will continue to be as welcoming to our new neighbours as you have been so far.

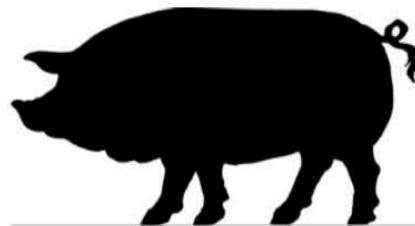

Result of 27th March Election

The Town Council welcomes Barry Starkie as Town Councillor for Kirton in Lindsey. The Town Council also thanks Mark Goring and David O'Brien for their interest in the role and those residents who engaged in the democratic process which is outside of the control of Kirton in Lindsey Town Council.

Annual Town Council Meeting

7th May sees the Annual Town Council Meeting, which includes nominations for the Mayor, Deputy Mayor and other roles and responsibilities including memberships of committees and representation to serve on outside bodies. More details about the decisions made will be published in July.

Unnamed Streets – Named!

Back in 2023 we launched a survey of residents about the unnamed paths in the town. There was a keen interest to retain the existing network of paths, as if they go unrecorded they could in time be lost. Thanks to those of you who responded back in 2023 and wished to see the paths protected by returning your answers to the survey. The recording of the paths could only be achieved with support from residents who were happy to confirm that they use the paths, that they are needed and wanted to see them named! The next steps were for the Town Council to work with North Lincolnshire Council to for the process to be started. At the beginning of April this work completed, and the installation of signage took place (however Duck Lane will not now be progressed). We hope that the recording of these paths will see them protected and create more awareness of the recent and older history of Kirton in Lindsey. In addition to this, Cllr Hazel Fox also worked with residents of King Edward Street to have the signage for the houses around the Green better identified.

There was also the presentation of grant funding to groups and organisations in the town and the opportunity to engage in an open forum. Plenty of groups and organisations were represented and were able to network and chat in a relaxed environment with refreshments. The draft minutes are now published on the Town Council website so that everyone is able to access them.

Electric Blanket testing

Thank you to those who took their electric blankets for testing at the Community Café on 3rd April. The event proved that there was interest in the town for this to be carried out and North Lincolnshire Council plan to return to carry out more electric blanket testing in September or October, so look out for more information nearer the time.

Grant Awards

Each year the Town Council welcomes applications for Budgeted Grants from town groups and organisations and these are considered around the budget setting period in November.

Presentations for these grants took place at the Annual Town Meeting. Representatives from the organisations spoke of their activities and use of the grant awards: • 1st Kirton in Lindsey Brownies - £500.00 • 1st Kirton in Lindsey Scouts - £600.00 • Diamond Jubilee Town Hall - £3,870.00 • KLASSIC Park - £4,000.00 • Kirton First -£2,000.00 • Nutshell - £400.00. Additional 2025 Budgeted Grants awarded, but no one present at the meeting to receive the presentations were: • Evergreens - £800.00 • In Bloom - £1,000.00 and • Mini Bloom - £500.00

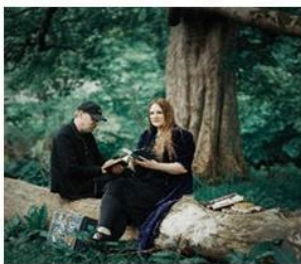


FRIDAY 16th MAY - THE HUNCH

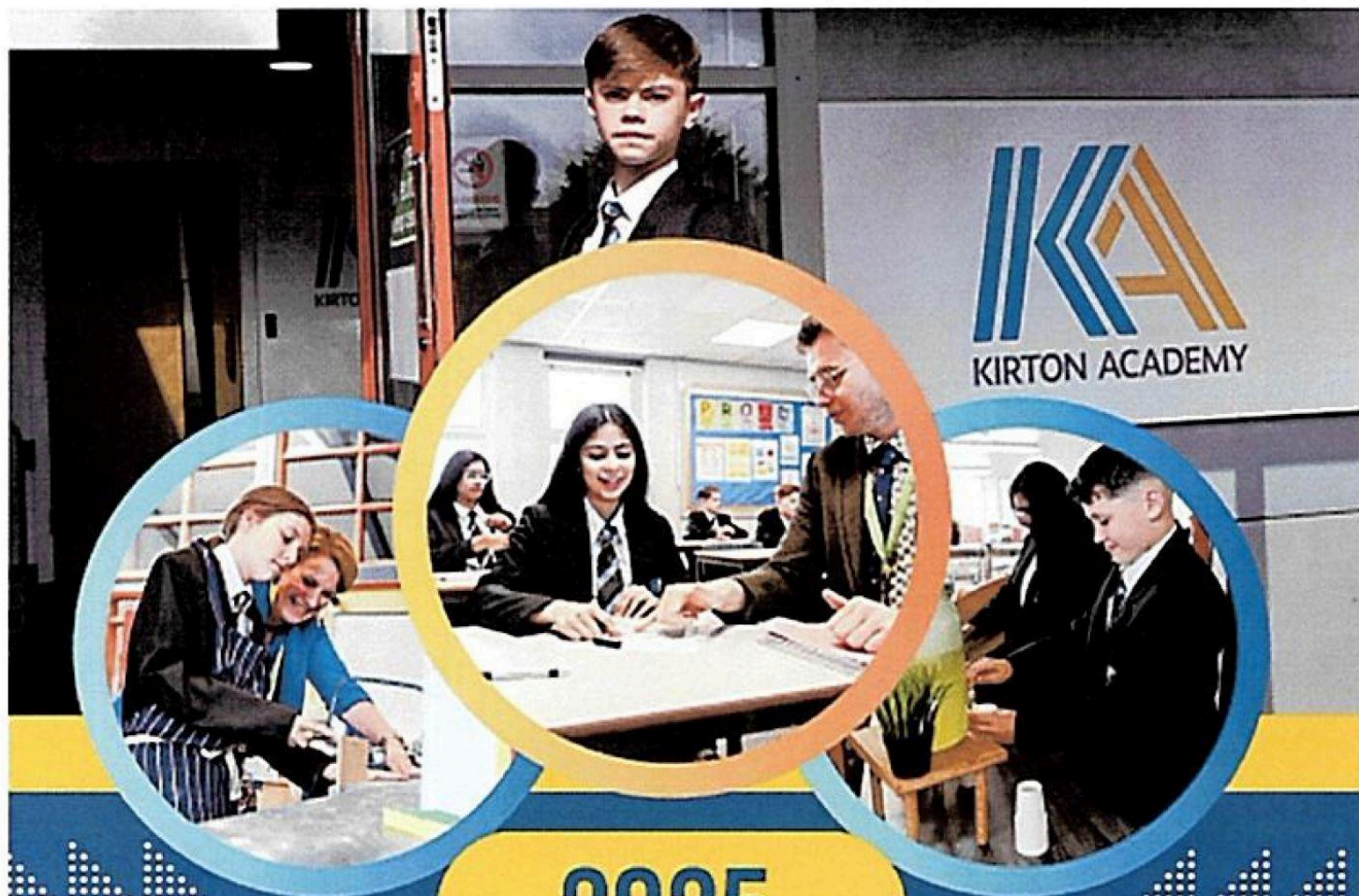
